NOTES:

- Human Services courses that transfer to UVIC as CYC credit can be used as Arts courses. Such courses, however, cannot be used to satisfy the requirement of two courses in the Social Sciences (See item B).
- Prior to September, 2002, Women's Studies can be used as either a Humanities or Social Science. Commencing September, 2002, Women's Studies is a Social Science course only.
- KPE 102, 103, 212 and 213 are each classified as Science courses. KPE 100 is classified as Science when taken with KPE 102 and 103; otherwise, KPE 100 is a course from the Other Areas category.
- Both Commerce 240 and 241 must be completed to receive three credits towards an Associate Degree.
