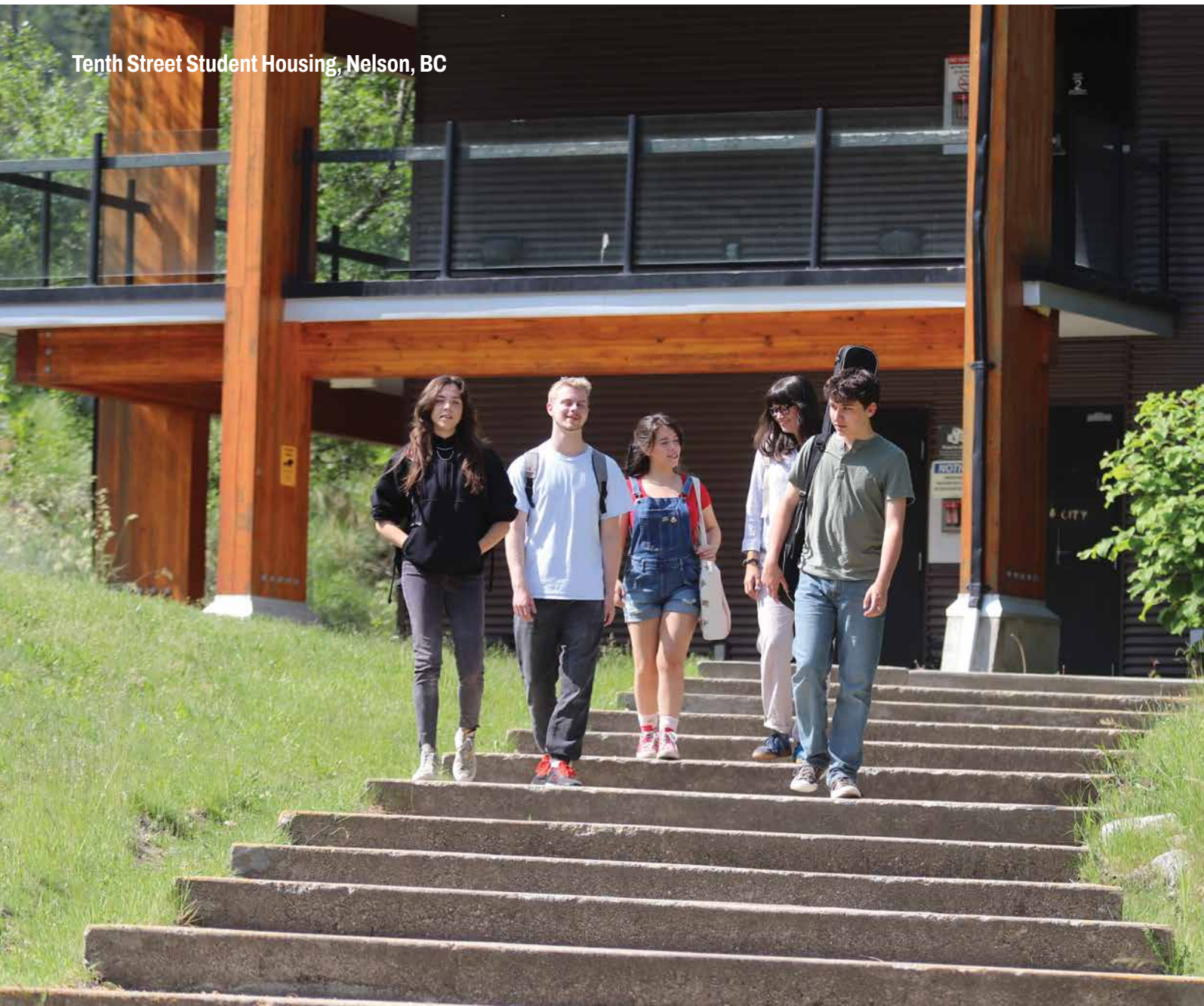

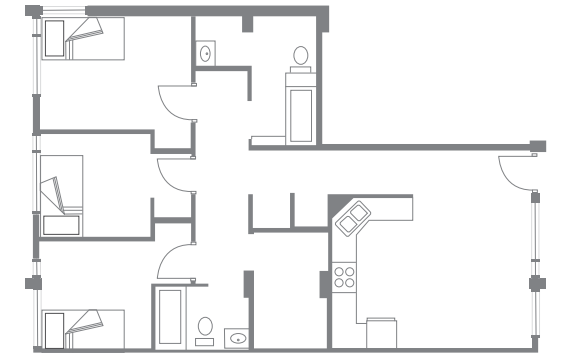

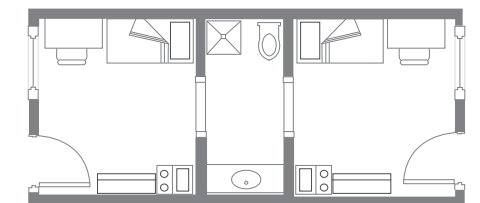

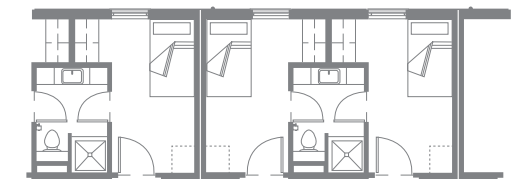

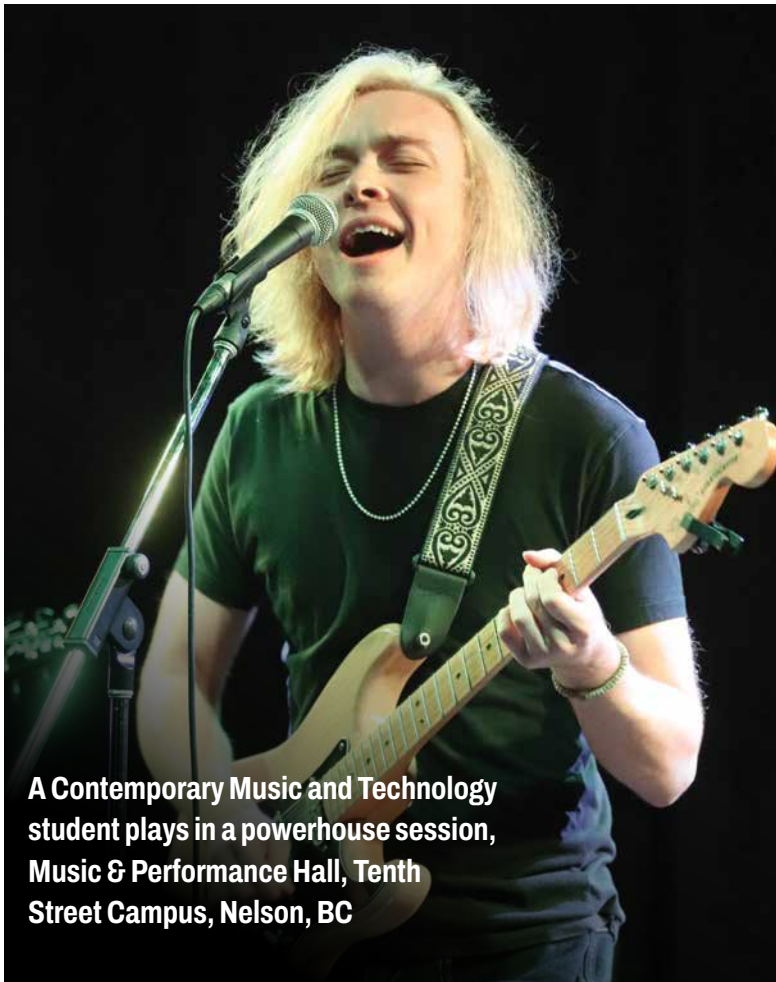

Start your degree at Selkirk College and transfer to university to complete your bachelor's degree.

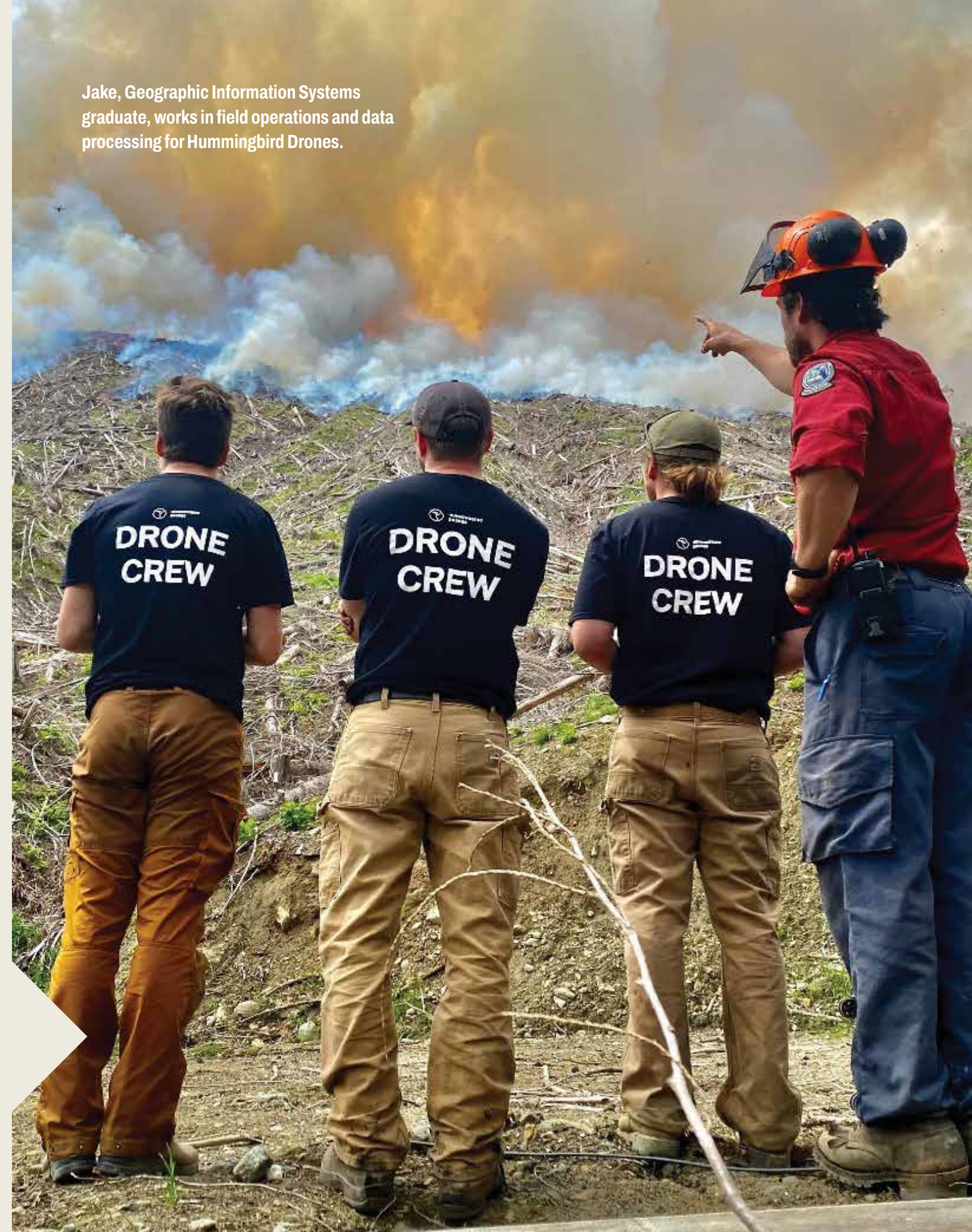

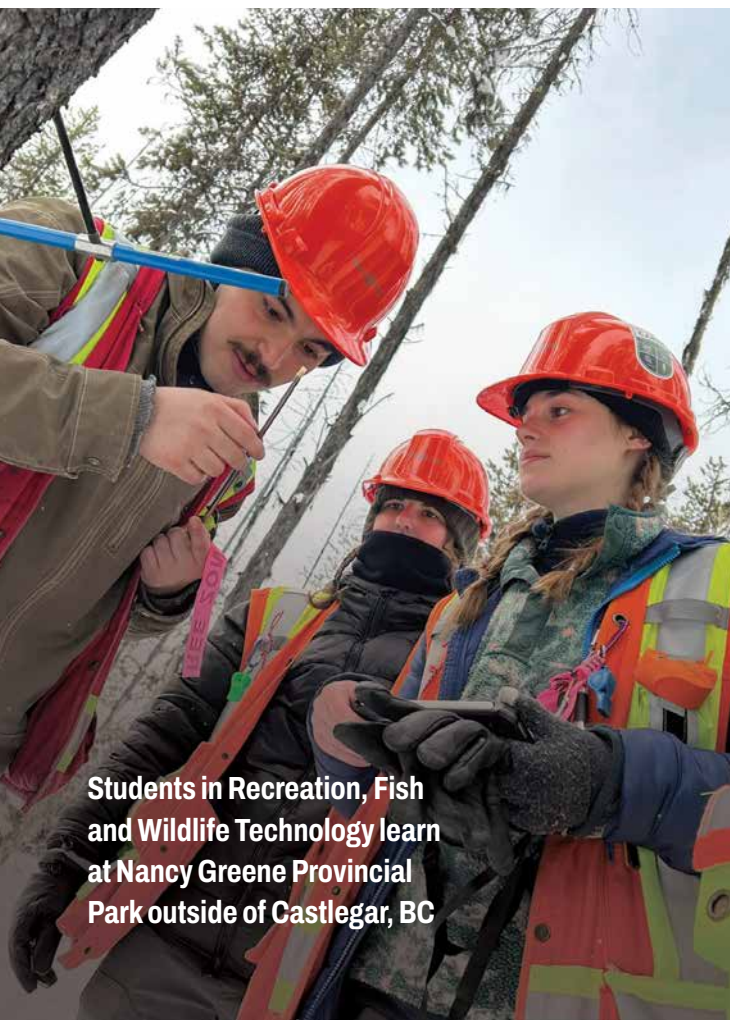

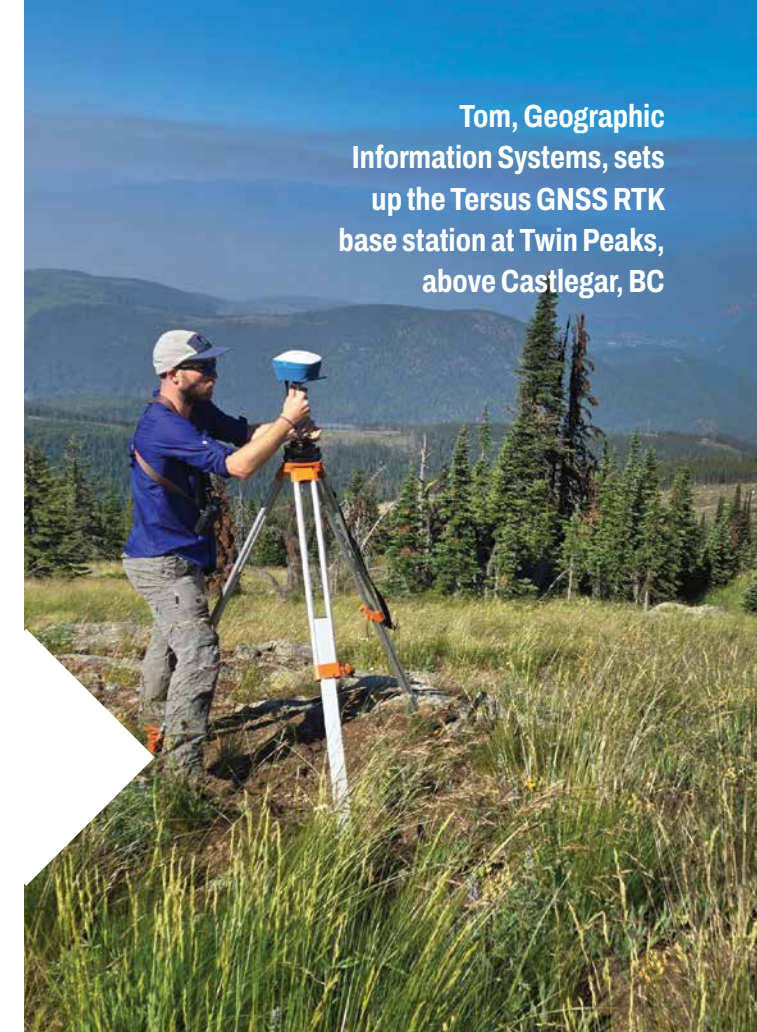

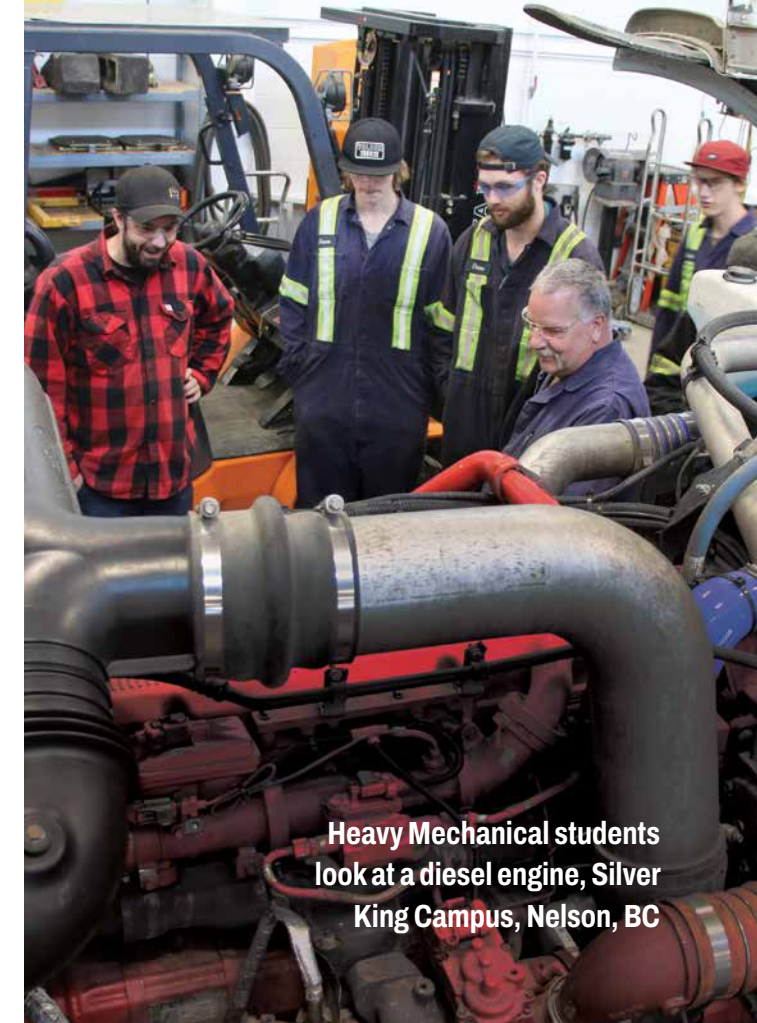

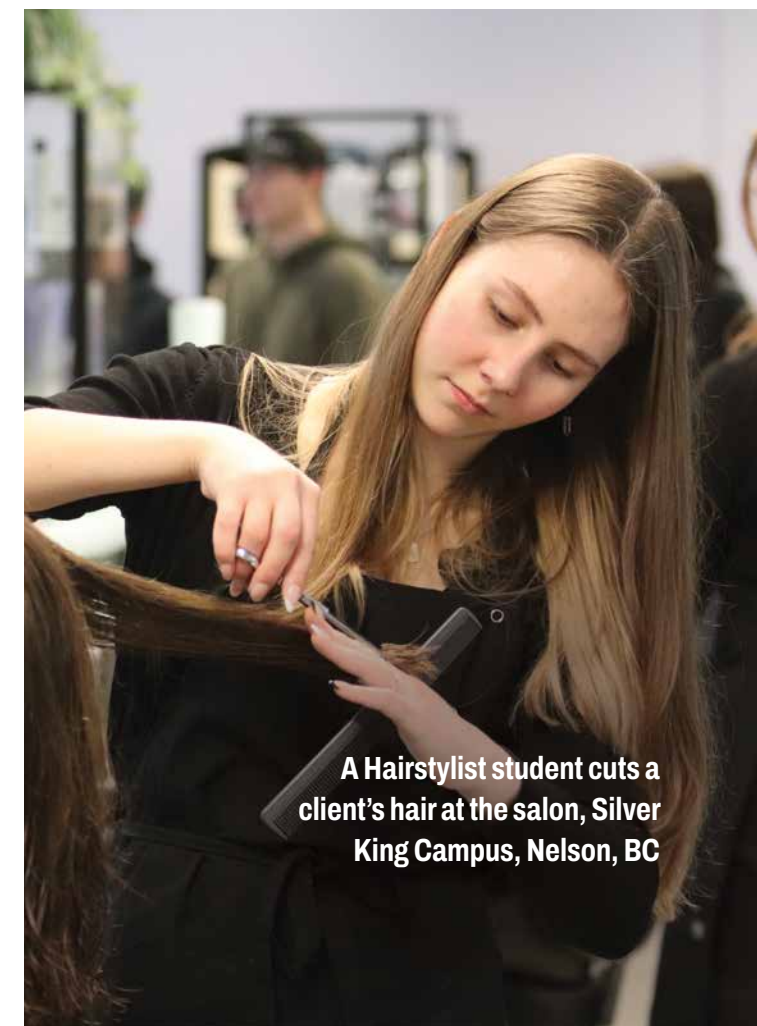
