POSITION SUMMARY

This research project aims to better understand the barriers and opportunities in developing the regional cannabis sector and to co-design, co-pilot and co-evaluate viable action plans generated by diverse stakeholders. This student intern position focuses on conducting background research for a regional branding and marketing initiative.

This student internship position is specifically designed for students to:

- Transfer their understanding of concepts and skills learned in class to real life projects
- Develop professional competencies related to their course of studies

Reporting to the Project Director, and the Community Researcher, the student intern will:

- Support the gathering of data through surveys, interviews and focus groups.
- Analyze data gathered (in Excel and NIVIO) and produce executive summaries of results.
- Support the creation and execution of an implementation plan for potential action items, including a
 Kootenay Brand, a Kootenay certification program, a regional appellation program, a Cannabis Quality
 Alliance (modelled after the VQA) designation, and a robust marketing campaign that may include
 Kootenay based podcasts, a docuseries, producer profiles, and the development of a cannabis trail among
 various other components.
- Support regional engagement events with outreach, planning, documentation and follow-up.
- Facilitate and organize an event that brings industry personnel and government together to build relationships and support.
- Other assigned duties primarily aimed at supporting research for the economic development of the regional cannabis sector, and marketing and branding the regional cannabis sector.





The ideal candidate is a career-oriented individual who is looking to gain valuable work experience and networking opportunities. The role will be based at Selkirk Innovates, Selkirk College's department that focuses on Applied Research and Innovation. In addition to fulfilling their research responsibilities, the intern will support the department's operations and/or interdepartmental collaborations.

This internship will primarily take place virtually. Some in-person work on site may be requested within the RDCK and RDKB for focus groups, interviews, and/or meetings.

The successful applicant will be required to enroll in the Selkirk Innovates applied research internship training program, which currently does not have a fee. Applicants may be offered a position on an eligibility list to fill similar positions if available.
